Likewise, the written speech reflects spiritual knowledge, development, and appreciation of God's Word as well as evidence of intellectual thinking and positive expression. Your speech should be about live, society or human nature/condition that needs to be turned toward God's love and light.

In-Person

The Oratorical Speeches will be held "In-Person" Wednesday, July 12, 2023, at Macedonian MBC, 2729 Lipscomb Street, Melbourne, FL 32901.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION

Oratorical participants must be:

- In the 10th or 11th grades (2023/2024 School Year)
- Home church must be apart of the MZNEC District Association
- Only one participation per Church

PRESENTATION

- Participants <u>are encouraged</u> to memorize the oration/speech. No sign-song tone, notes, props. Or any other aids are allowed
- The speech must be **prepared by** the **contestant** and **must be original**
- Orations are <u>not</u> to exceed five minutes and must be typed and double-spaced (Times New Roman font, size 12). A minimum requirement of 300 words maximum of 800 words.
- Include the total number of words at the bottom of your document.
- The speech must be logical, correct in form, relevant to the theme, and a response to the time based on the key Scripture and prompt. The speech will analyze your identity as a disciple who lives as light or who will move towards the Light.
- You are encouraged to use the **key Scripture** and at least **two other Scriptures** to support your position.

- You are encouraged to use statistical data to support your position.
- Any quotations or copyright material used in the speech must be properly identified.

The Presentation attire is as follows:

Males: Suit Coats with ties

Females: Dress or Suit with hosiery

DELIVERY

- Participants are to stand, state the topic and begin their memorized oration.
- Participants are not allowed to use introductions or reference protocols.
- Participants shall not state their names or any other identifying data during the oration.
- Participants shall avoid using a sing-song tone, sermonette format and avoid excessive gestures in their presentation. Likewise, no dancing, rapping, etc.
- Special props, costumes, clothing or prompts are not permitted.
- Any violations of the guidelines will automatically disqualify the contestant.
